

NC-002 Group 2 Emblem Meaning



The Group 2 emblem features a four-color shield design that reflects the North Carolina State Flag and echoes the design of the North Carolina Wing shield. The blue field to the bearer's right and the red-over-white field to the bearer's left symbolize state pride and unity across the wing.

Three white diamonds in the blue field represent the pinnacle of cadet achievement and denote the Cadet Programs mission. A centrally placed compass rose symbolizes navigation, safety, and direction, reflecting the Emergency Services mission. A diagonal blue line bordered by yellow lines represents an airstrip, symbolizing Aerospace Education, while also forming the Roman numeral "II" to designate Group 2.

The emblem uses official CAP colors—blue, red, white, and yellow—to reinforce professionalism, mission focus, and affiliation with Civil Air Patrol. The group name appears in a white scroll with blue lettering, bordered in yellow, in accordance with heraldry standards for group-level emblems.
