Emblem Meaning



The Burlington Composite Squadron patch features a central emblem consisting of a black spade, symbolizing operational focus, control, and structured precision. Nested within the spade is a red three-bladed propeller, representing aviation capability and the vital role of powered flight in squadron operations.

Flanking the spade are two additional symbols: a red heart, signifying the squadron's humanitarian service and life-saving mission, and a black club, denoting strength, unity, and resilience in both air and ground operations. Identification scrolls with a white background and yellow text provide distinction and clarity; the top scroll reads "Double Deuces," while the bottom scroll displays "Burlington Composite Squadron."

The color palette reinforces the patch's symbolism: red valor and dedication, blue represents trust, loyalty, and the flight domain, black reflects authority and strength, white stands for integrity and transparency, and yellow signifies excellence, honor, and distinction.
