- The Chief of Education and Training manages the Education and Training Program.
- The Director of Mentoring, the Specialty Tracks Coordinator, and the Volunteer University Provost work with the Chief to implement the program.







Step 2 – On the next screen under Accomplishments click on Professional Levels



Specialty Tracks

Specialty tracks were developed to provide senior members with the training and tools necessary to develop proficiency in areas of personal interest or in areas needed to support unit operations.

Each rating contains the following requirements – STAK

Service – Requires the length of time to serve in each rating period

Training – Objectives that require the member to learn systems and process

Activities – Objectives describing what the member is expected to complete

Knowledge – Objectives describing what the member is expected to know - quiz

Specialty Track Guides – located in Pamphlets on gocivilairpatrol.com

Ratings:

Technician – learning, performing duties, becoming proficient at the squadron level – Leadership Ribbon

Senior – advancing in specialty, organizing and coordinating activities, group and wing involvement – Bronze Star

Master – serving at group or higher, mentoring others in specialty, advancing knowledge and experience – Silver Star





Introduction



- . Know where to find more information about OPSEC and cyber security.






Virtual In-Residence Enrollment


