

NC-999 North Carolina Wing Legislative Squadron

Emblem Meaning



The Legislative Squadron emblem features a three-color disc design in red, white, and blue, reflecting the colors and layout of the North Carolina State Flag. This design highlights the squadron's unique composition of elected officials, state senators, representatives, and legislative staff who serve as members of the Civil Air Patrol.

In the upper left quadrant, the silver-gray silhouette of the North Carolina Legislative Building signifies the unit's direct connection to state government. In the lower left quadrant, the Civil Air Patrol triangle and three-bladed propeller represent the squadron's active membership and support of CAP's missions. The right side of the disc mirrors the blue field of the state flag and features the yellow letters "NC," reinforcing the emblem's representation of North Carolina.

The upper scroll displays the state motto, "*Esse Quam Videri*"—"To be, rather than to seem"—symbolizing authenticity and integrity. The lower scroll bears the squadron name. Both scrolls use the official CAP color palette of blue and Air Force yellow. The emblem's red, white, and blue reflect patriotism and state pride, while blue and yellow denote the unit's affiliation with the U.S. Air Force. Silver-gray represents volunteer service and echoes the tones of the official CAP seal.
