Spotlight on NC Wing Operations Maj Robert Call, NC Wing Director of Operations



Maj Robert Call is the NCWG Director of Operations. Maj Call has been a CAP member for nine years and began his CAP career with the Burlington Composite Squadron (NC-022), which he still considers home. He has served as a Squadron Operations Officer, the Group IV Operations Officer and as an Assistant DO for the wing managing proficiency flying. He was named wing Director of Operations in November of 2022. He holds Master ratings in Emergency Services and Information Technology and a Senior rating in Operations. By day, he is a Senior IT Analyst for the Duke Eye Center.

The NCWG Operations directorate is responsible for all activities related to aircraft management, pilot qualifications and training and aircraft maintenance. Our team of fourteen members from across the wing manage all funding related to flying except for Emergency Services aircrew training.

We work with the Operations and Logistics staff at the region and national levels on a daily basis to ensure that the wing complies with all CAP and FAA regulations for both fixed wing and sUAS (Drone) aircraft, and that we are being good stewards of taxpayer's money.

Our aircraft maintenance team (Wing Aircraft Maintenance Officers) work with headquarters and our Squadron AMO's to ensure that our seventeen aircraft are always in top condition and mission ready. Last year the team funded and managed nearly 4,000 hours of flight time across all of our wide range of missions, landing us in the top three wings in CAP for per aircraft utilization. Level II and Level III Moderated Modules – In-Person at Conference and Hybrid

NCWG is offering the moderated modules for Level II and Level III prior to the Wing Conference. We will be onsite at the Guilford Technical Community College (GTCC), Greensboro, only 22 miles from the conference hotel.

Levels II & III Moderated Modules

Level II will be held entirely in person on 22 Mar from 0900-1700. You must have completed Level I to enroll. Students must agree to read all the student guides (see link below) and complete all assignments prior to 22 Mar. The course will consist of a discussion of the relevant material, not a lecture. We are only covering the modules marked with an M for moderated. Modules marked with an A are automated and can be completed through AXIS.

The preferred uniform is the Class B uniform (Air Force blues) or corporate equivalent. However, you may wear the corporate polo uniform if you don't have the Class B uniform.

Level III is split into two sessions. Day 1 is on Saturday, 16 Mar in a virtual session through Teams from 0900-1600. Day 2 is on 22 Mar in person at GTCC from 0900-1700. You must have completed Level II to enroll. Students must agree to read all the student guides (see link below) and complete the virtual course reading and assignments before 16 Mar and the same for the in-person modules by 22 Mar. Level V – 13-17 April

The Mid-Atlantic Region is conducting an onsite Level V course at Camp Fretterd Military Reservation, 5600 Rue Saint Lo Drive, Reisterstown MD, on 13-17 April. Members must have completed Level IV to be eligible to register for Level V. The primary focus in Level V is on developing a strategic view of the organization and continued leadership skills. Level V focuses on developing the region or national level leader. This is the highest level of CAP career development and is for those officers performing duty as commanders or staff officers at the region or national level.

Successful completion of Level V of the Education and Training Program qualifies the CAP officer for the Gill Robb Wilson Award, the highest education and training award earned by a senior member. After registering, you will receive the student packet containing course instructions, course schedule, homework list, and readahead materials. The course will begin promptly on 13 Apr at noon. How Do I Use Registration Zone?

The Registration Zone has been developed to serve as a centralized hub, offering members a single, comprehensive platform for all CAP events, simplifying event management, and reducing the burden on members. With Registration Zone, you can easily register for events, manage your attendance, and stay updated on the latest happenings in the CAP community. Click <u>Registration Zone User Guide</u> to download information and instructions on how to use this new tool. You will be able to set up your events for your members and open registration to others outside your local unit (if applicable).

You have access to events throughout the country. Some events are in person, some are virtual. Under *My Stuff*, click on *Event Registration*. This will initially list all events in date order. Use the column headings to sort through the events. Click on the column heading *Event* to list all titles in alphabetical order. If you click on *Organization*, it will be sorted alphabetically by region.

Selecting an event will open another page with all the details and the opportunity to register.

Another way to sort is to go to *Reports* -> *Event Listing*. In this example to the right, we selected the Organization MAR-NC-001, entered a *Start Date* of 3/1/24, and left the End Date blank. After clicking on View Report, the results are displayed. (if the result is too small to read on this page, increase the size in the bottom right of the Word document to view it)

- Email Maj Crawford a copy of your provider card and online instructor course completion certificate

- After completion of the course, you must be monitored teaching a Heartsaver course within 60 days. A provider course is scheduled for July.
