
Why Participate in Education and Training?



Uploading Documents to Professional Levels

Documentation is required for items in Levels III, IV, and V. The below example is how to enter ANY item for ANY Level that requires documentation. For example, one requirement for Level III is attendance at two conferences. If you are not working in Level III yet (only working in Level I or II), save the document to your computer to upload to Level III Professional Levels when you have access.

Example for Level III: Documentation for attending a conference

Click on the item being entered, making sure there is a checkmark showing before submitting







The box next to the Gold Circle MUST be checked. The Gold Circle with the exclamation point (!) indicates that documentation must be uploaded.

Enter the completion date in "Date Completed" and in the Comments box enter information to help the validator.




Click on the Submit button at the bottom of the page. Return to the page to ensure the entry and documentation are there. It will be pending until approved.

Reviewing Pending and Approved Items in Professional Levels

Now that you have submitted documentation (see the above article), go back into Professional Levels to review pending and approved items. The example of pending and approved items in Level V below shows how to read the screen. (If the print is too small to read, enlarge the document on your screen)


The box insert provides information on tasks that require approval and the highest approval level required.



Updates to Regulations, Pamphlets, and Forms

We notified you about changes to CAP regulations, pamphlets, and forms in February. It is important to keep updated in your duty position and work area. It only takes a few minutes to check on this each month. Put a reminder on your calendar!

To view the Publication Library, on the main CAP website, click https://www.gocivilairpatrol.com then click on Members, and then choose Publication Library. The main four areas you will want to look at are listed to the right.



If you click on Interim Change Letters (ICL), the most recent changes are listed at the top of that page. An ICL is published to change items in a regulation without the entire regulation being republished. The update has gone into effect and will appear in the regulation's body when republished later. Check out these changes since our last notification article in February.



How Do I...

The "How Do I" section contains items and tips that will help members navigate eServices, find information and provide "I didn't know that" items.

How Do I Stay Up to Date on eServices Changes and Other Important Information?



If you are not familiar with reviewing information in the News section on the eServices main screen, take a moment and see what it contains. Among updates and "fixes" in administrative items in different areas such as WMIRS, IT, Personnel, Logistics, Operations, CAPSIS, etc. there are important notices of when NHQ offices are closed for holidays, position openings, as well as other announcements. The "eServices Release Notes" document has all the notifications dating back to 30 April 2019. This is quite handy if you missed reviewing the notes for a week or two. You can get caught up by just clicking on the latest date.

Did you see the announcement on 5 May for the Dare to Reimagine (D2R) Civil Air Patrol Member Application Development Sandbox on 5 May? Click here to read a preview of what this is all about. It is expected to go online in January 2024.

How Do I Earn the Brig Gen Charles E Yeager Award?

The Yeager Award is a requirement of Level II in the Education and Training Program. This award recognizes the successful completion of the Yeager test portion of the Aerospace Education Program for Senior Members (AEPSM).

From CAPR 50-1 CAP Aerospace Education Mission

7.1. Yeager Test. This test is a self-paced study for senior members and is based on the CAP text, Aerospace: The Journey of Flight. This test will increase members' knowledge of aviation and space and help them appreciate the importance of CAP's AE mission. Once members are ready to take the test, they have two

options; open book or closed book. Members are encouraged to take the test online through CAP's Learning Management System, or they may opt to take a paper test at their unit. For more information about the Yeager testing procedures, refer to CAPP 50-1.

Aerospace: Journey of Flight 4th Edition is available in eServices under AE Download and Resources in the Aerospace Education section. The Yeager test can be found in the Learning Management System/AXIS in eServices. After successfully completing



the test, members receive a certificate and are authorized to wear the Yeager Award ribbon. All senior members are encouraged to make aerospace education an integral part of their CAP experience.

Aircrew Tool - WingX



We are presenting once again the Hilton Software WingX app. To our newer members and those who are or will be aircrew members or have missed this article the last two years, the company offers a free subscription to all CAP members to their leading-edge mobile aviation app for Apple and Android – WingX.

Our qualified CAP pilots have a free subscription to ForeFlight, an integrated flight tool they use on their devices for flight planning and in the airplane. Aircrew members who are not Form 5 pilots cannot access a free subscription to ForeFlight.

Wing X gives Mission Observers, Mission Scanners, and Airborne Photographers the ability to learn and use flight planning, weather conditions, terrain, airspeed, headings, and follow the map while you are flying. The app has VFR sectionals, IFR charts, weather, and many more features. The airplane travels on the moving map. You can zoom in on the screen to help compare what you are viewing out the window. It helps you to know where you are!
