Education and Training Program

Education and Training Level II's Four Paths

Education and Training Officers assist new members with navigating CAP's Education and Training Program.

Former Military Former Cadet Professional New Member While completing the modules for Level I they work with the new member in identifying if they are a former member of the military, a professional that will be seeking an advanced grade, a former cadet, or if those categories don't fit, the new member category. In Professional Levels Level I, a selection is made. This determines the modules a member will complete in Level II.

CAP recognizes that members bring various experiences and expertise with them. This is the reason behind the four paths in Level II. For example, a former military member or

former cadet already knows basic drill, so they would not complete that Level II module. A professional or new member does not have experience in wearing a uniform so their module about uniforms is different than a former military member or former cadet who only needs to know the differences. Former military and professionals need to know about advanced grades and expectations.

After a former military, former cadet, and professional member completes Level II Part 1, they are eligible for an advanced grade. The Personnel Officer gathers the needed documentation for these members and submits it to the squadron commander with a <u>CAPF 2</u> for approval. A new member is eligible after completing Level II Part 1 and six months of service. <u>CAPR 35-5</u> outlines appointments and promotion eligibility. Level II Part II requires all members to achieve the Yeager Award and a technician rating in a Specialty Track. <u>CAPR 40-1</u> details the Senior Member Education and Training Program. Please reach out to your squadron's ETO to review your progression and further information.

Level III Requirement – Mentor a Member Through Level I

A Level III requirement is for a member to have the opportunity to work closely with a new member – mentor a member through Level I. Do you remember when you first joined as a senior member? There was so much to learn that it seemed to be

drinking from a firehose. We can assist our newer members with navigating eServices, understanding uniforms, the chain of command, missions, customs and courtesies, CAP Core Values, and safety. All this and more are in the Level I modules that new members complete.

A member that has not completed this Level III requirement can be a mentor to a new member. Even if you are not working in Level III yet, you can complete this requirement, obtain documentation and then upload it to Professional Levels, Level III when you are working in that Level. PLEASE NOTE: anyone can and should mentor a new member, even if you do not need to complete this requirement.

Level I is mainly completing the modules however you can help new members with much more. Introduce them to other members and various duty positions. Help them identify where and how they would like to serve in the squadron. Lay the groundwork for Level II and emergency services training. It is very rewarding to help others and see them become a valuable team member of a unit.

Specialty Tracks

Are you currently working on a specialty track rating? All members should review where they are in progressing through their specialty track(s). As you work with a mentor or Subject Matter Expert, you become more confident and proficient in your duty position, which helps the Squadron, Group, and Wing.



If you are new to CAP, Specialty Track Study Guides can be downloaded from the main CAP Website under Members -> Publications -> Pamphlets. Many study guides are in the revision process. Check out the site to see if your

specialty has a newer study guide. The guides were originally in a 200 series numbering system. When guides are revised, they are renumbered to the 40 series except for AE which is in the 50 series, and Cadet Programs in the 60 series. The Specialty Track Study Guides contain the Service, Training, Activity, and Knowledge (STAK) components that are needed to achieve each rating. In addition, the regulations and pamphlets that are involved in your specialty are identified. The checklists identify items to accomplish that assist you with learning your specialty.

If you do not have a mentor or Subject Matter Expert (SME) in your squadron or group, reach out to the <u>NC Wing Subject Matter Experts</u>. They are available to assist you in your specialty area.


The "How Do I" section contains items and tips that will help members navigate eServices, find information and provide "I didn't know that" items.

How Do I Set Up a "One-Click" List of Favorites in eServices?

Setting up a "one-click" list of favorites is a great time saver when you frequently visit specific pages in eServices. Follow these easy instructions:

- Click on your name and gear symbol in the top right-hand corner of the main eServices screen
- Click on the "+" sign on the Favorites line. This will open a new page that shows a list of the links you can make favorites.






- Click on the "star" next to your selection to turn it into a "gold star" favorite.

How Do I Find Credit for Any of the Past Three National Conferences I Attended?



Did you attend any of the last three National Conferences? A Level III requirement is for members to attend two Wing, Region, or National conferences. **If you attended the 2022 National Conference, your certificate is now posted.** You will find certificates for the 2020 and 2021 virtual conferences as well.

Last month we posted an article on how to view completed online training in the Learning Management System and AXIS. Finding the certificates for national conferences is the same. In eServices click on *Menu*, then *Online Learning*, then *Learning Management System*.

Next click on Past Results under Modules in the left column

The next page displays certificates and test results. There are courses listed in both LMS and AXIS. Click on the tab to view all of your courses

and certificates. The last three National Conference Attendance Credits are posted here. Click on "print certificate". Save it to your computer so you can upload it to Professional Levels - Level III.

If any course you have completed has a certificate associated with it, click on *print certificate*. By saving certificates to your computer, you will have a record on your computer for easy access.

2023 NC Wing Conference – 9-11 March 2023 – Registration is Open!

Registration will be opening for the 2023 NC Wing Conference! After conducting two virtual Wing conferences, the 2023 conference will be held at the Embassy Suites in Greensboro. A Senior IG Course 3/9 &10) and Water Survival Course (3/10) are offered as pre-conference sessions. Over 20 seminars, general assembly and award recognition, banquet, cadet program track, and cadet ball. Please note that a Level III requirement in the Senior Member Education and Training Program is for members to attend two conferences.

Level IV Moderated Modules - 15 November



There are 14 moderated modules in Level IV. Class dates are the third Tuesday of each month at 1900 hrs. beginning on 21 Jun and ending on 20 Dec. Two modules each class night are offered to spread the entire course time over seven months.

The class size is limited to 20 and will be conducted in Teams. You must have completed Level III to enroll in Level IV modules.

There are individual sign-ups for each date. You can register for one or both modules for that date. Cohorts, Virtual In-Residence, and through this venue provides the opportunity to take modules in various ways, whatever your schedule permits.

November Modules: Recruiting and Retention and Mentoring Skills and Program Development

There is pre-course work required to be completed prior to the class. It is the responsibility of the student to be fully prepared to participate in the class to receive credit. Training Leaders of Cadets Basic - Group 6 - 12 Nov

The Iredell Composite Squadron is hosting a Group 6 in-person Training Leaders of Cadets - Basic course on 12 Nov 2022. Training Leaders of Cadets is the premiere venue for Cadet Programs Officers to learn how to become better mentors of cadets and more effective managers of cadet squadrons. A TLC course is required every 48 months to maintain currency.

Geospatial Damage Assessment Training Reminder



You can continue to help support FEMA conduct imagery-based damage assessments. On behalf of the CAP Geospatial Program, all CAP members are eligible to apply and help. CAP has assisted in hurricane and tornado assessments. Hurricane Fiona caused significant damage in Puerto Rico and Hurricane lan's massive size caused widespread destruction in Florida and in South Carolina as it climbed the east coast.

You can complete the training and support disaster response regardless of where you live. Complete the training now and
