The conference will include discovery sessions, learning labs, exciting keynotes, and a collaboration and social space dubbed 'The Hangar.' It will also include national awards and a Saturday Night Commander's Reception. This year, a new national commander will be installed.

Introducing the New Learning Management System - Absorb



The current Learning Management System (LMS) that Civil Air Patrol uses to provide education and training material to members is AXIS. Volunteer University modules, emergency service and operations training, specialty track tests, cadet training, and a variety of other training are contained here. When completing training and tests in AXIS, the program transfers the information to eServices. These are two separate systems.

As part of Civil Air Patrol's commitment to continuous

improvement and supporting the remarkable growth of our organization over the past few years, CAP is thrilled to unveil our new learning system, Absorb LMS! Aborb is replacing AXIS. Absorb has flexibility and more capabilities that will enhance member's learning. All online training and courses in AXIS will be in Absorb.

A few of the exciting features include:

- Transfer of prior online completions so that records and transcripts are accurate.
- Retaking courses is significantly improved via the reenroll button on available courses.
- Start moderated modules at any time without needing to request a cohort.
- View and sign up for any available Virtual-In-Residence course sessions.

In preparation for the change, there will be announcements, training sessions, and resources. All coursework completed in AXIS will transfer to Absorb. Unfinished or in-progress work will not be transferred. Completed work in eServices will not be affected. It is highly recommended to download a copy of your current transcript to your computer so you can make sure everything is transferred over to Absorb.

The transition will be in early summer; however, the exact date has not been set yet. We will keep you informed.

Squadron and Group Commander Courses Interest Period

The Volunteer University Virtual In-Residence Program offers Squadron Commander (SCC) and Group Commander Courses (GCC). These courses are designed to provide training and



resources to those interested in squadron and group command. They also help staff officers understand more about what goes into operating a successful squadron and how to support the commander.

ViR accepts eligible members' interest in these courses throughout the year. This system of interest periods is designed to better tailor the registration process for the Command Electives. Typically, by the close date of the interest period, slotting (registration) for individual modules begins. Openings in a semester will be offered to registrants in the next interest period when they occur. Click the <u>Fall 2024 Squadron Commander Course</u> or the <u>Spring 2025 Commander Course</u> to register your interest in a course.

Specialty Tracks and Subject Matter Experts



Congratulations to all members who have completed and are working on specialty track ratings. CAP Specialty Tracks are integral to Civil Air Patrol's Education and Training Program. They provide a standard knowledge base for all CAP members at all levels. This consistent foundation ensures the quality of training available through all CAP units nationwide. In turn, this gives members the tools to perform the CAP missions required by the US Air Force. Members enroll at the level of None and progress through

knowledge and service requirements to Technician, Senior, and Master ratings in their specialty tracks.

The requirements outlined for each rating in a Specialty Track Guide provide the basis for the knowledge and skills needed to perform your duties. The rating requirements also allow you to progress through CAP's Education and Training Program's five Levels (including promotion eligibility). Specialty Track Study Guides are found under the Publications Library in the Pamphlets section on the NHQ website.

Work with a mentor or subject matter expert to learn your chosen duty and progress through the ratings. If you do not have a mentor with a higher rating in your specialty track, go to the NC Wing Subject Matter Experts page on the NC Wing website. These members are ready and willing to assist you

Reading Professional Levels Screens – Part 1

We ran this series back in 2022. For the next few months, we will discuss how to read the Professional Levels screens. Have you been wondering why modules are listed in different groups? Not sure what the letter "i" in the gold circle means? What about seeing that there are two or three modules in a group, but you only are required to complete one? This series will help by providing information on what you are viewing.

Today, we'll begin with accessing Professional Levels.

Step 1 – In eServices, click on Menu → Professional Development → Professional Levels

Step 2 – On the next screen under Accomplishments, click on **Professional Levels**





Step 3 – On the next screen, under Select Level, click on the down arrow and select the Level you wish to review (Level 2 Part 1 is selected in this example) Group Commander Training

Level 2 Part 1 This will open up the screen that lists all the requirements for that Level. Note that Level II has two parts - 1 and 2. Why two parts? Members bring with them a varied amount of education and experience to Civil Air Patrol that the organization recognizes. Former military, professionals, and former cadets who achieved the Mitchell Award or higher and are eligible for an advanced grade have nine modules in Level II Part 1 that must be completed prior to receiving an advanced grade.

The screen below is from a member's Level II Part 1 Professional Levels



The "Completed / Required Task" item might be slightly confusing in Level II module requirements. In the above example, the Level 2 Part 1 "Customs and Courtesies" section shows Completed / Required Tasks - [1/1]; however, there are two modules listed in this section.

The reason for multiple modules is the four different "paths" based upon the categories of former military, former cadet, professional, and new member. Our former military members are very familiar with customs and courtesies, so they will take the Civil Air Patrol Customs and Courtesies module, while those in the professional or new member path take the Customs and Courtesies module. Former cadets do not take a module for Customs and Courtesies as they are very familiar with CAP's customs and courtesies.

NC Wing Annual Conference – Attendance Credit

Attending two National, Region, or Wing conferences is required for Level III in the CAP Education and Training Program. Uploading conference participation can be completed in just a few easy steps. You will need to have the Personnel Authorization document for conference attendance on your computer before you start. If you do not have this, check with your Education and Training Officer or Squadron Commander for the document. It was sent out by the wing personnel officer.

- Step 1 Access Professional Levels. In eServices, click on Menu \rightarrow Education and Training \rightarrow Professional Levels
- Step 2 Under Accomplishments, click on Professional Levels
- Step 3 Under Select Level, click on Level 3. If you are not working in Level 3 yet (only working in Levels I or II) save the document to your computer to upload to Level 3 Professional Levels when you have access. Members who have completed Level 3 do not record this "extra credit".
- Step 4 Scroll down to Conference Attendance. Click the box next to the Gold circle, enter the conference date in Date Completed, and in the Comments box, enter the name of the conference attended.
- Step 5 Upload the document from your computer
- Step 6 Click on the Submit button at the bottom of the page



The "How Do I" section contains items and tips to help members navigate eServices, find information, and provide "I didn't know that" items.


How Do I Upload My Picture to eServices?

Is your picture missing in eServices, or has it been a few years since you updated your photo? A member's picture is on the CAPF 101 Specialty Qualification Card. It is important to have a proper picture displayed on the 101 Card when you use it during a mission or mission training. Senior members' pictures are also on their CAP ID. It is preferred that you are in uniform for these documents. Instructions on requirements and how to

upload your picture are found by clicking the Membership


Please remember to update your "personal characteristics"

by clicking on your name in the top right corner of eServices to open "My Account" and then click on 'Characteristics." If you fly in a CAP airplane, you will assist the pilot by having weight information in your account so they can process the weight and balance. Remember to keep your information updated!





How Do I Stay Up to Date on eServices Changes and Other Important Information?



If you are not familiar with reviewing information in the News section on the eServices main screen, take a moment and see what it contains. Among updates and "fixes" in administrative items in different areas such as WMIRS, IT, Personnel, Logistics, Operations, CAPSIS, etc. there are important notices of when NHQ offices are closed for holidays, position openings, as well as other announcements. The "eServices Release Notes" document has all the notifications dating back to 30 April 2019. This is quite handy if you missed reviewing the notes for a week or two. You can get caught up by just clicking on the latest date. Did you see the announcements last week that Registration Zone now accepts payments for events? What about the announcement about the introduction of CAP Health?

And don't forget about PROPS Newsletters.

CPR and First Aid Course -13 July

The Burlington Composite Squadron is holding an American Heart Association CPR course on 13 July at NC Wing Headquarters, Burlington, from 0900 to 1500. The course will include how to correctly perform CPR on an adult, child, and infant. Basic first aid will also be covered. This will meet the requirements for Ground Team Member qualifications. The cost is only for supplies. This includes a CPR/First Aid Card valid for two years, Pocket **Iraining Class** Mask, and lunch. AHA offers a reduced price for members who are in the K-12 school system. The cost for K-12 Students/Teachers using their NC school system email address is \$20. The cost for everyone else is \$35.

American Heart Association Heartsaver Instructor Course - 1 June



Burlington Composite Squadron is offering an American Heart Association (AHA) Heartsaver Instructor Course on 1 Jun 2024 from 0900-1800. The course will be held at NC Wing HQ, 3520 Alamance Road, Burlington. Completing the course will allow

members to teach AHA CPR/First Aid courses at their local squadron. The cost is \$65, which is the affiliation fee to the training center. The deadline to register is 25 May.

Requirements:

- Attendees must be at least 18 years old and have a current AHA BLS or HeartSaver Card
- Complete the AHA Heartsaver Online Instructor Course (Cost \$35) https://shopcpr.heart.org/heartsaver-instructor-essentials-online
- Email Maj Crawford a copy of your provider card and online instructor course completion certificate
- After completion of the course, you must be monitored teaching a Heartsaver course within 60 days. A provider course is scheduled for July.

CAP Silvered Wings Series

The 16th painting in the second Silvered Wing Series of vintage CAP aircraft depicts the Helio U-100 / HT 295 Super Courier. The Helio Courier is a cantilever highwing light STOL (short takeoff and landing) utility aircraft designed in 1949.

The artist, Maj. Ron Finger is a freelance illustrator and member of the Minnesota Wing's Crow Wing Composite Squadron. Recently honored by the Minnesota Aviation Hall of Fame as Artist of the Year, he is an Air Force Art



Program artist, where a select pool of artists are assigned "art missions" to document specific U.S. Air Force operations.

Painting "to honor those who serve" is the motto on the art program patch and defines Finger's continuing efforts as an aviation artist. His staff position as CAP's national artist feeds his passion for researching and creating art that portrays historical emergency service. Collegiate Transfer Program



On Jan. 4, 2022, CAP signed a Collegiate Matriculation Agreement with Frederick Community College in Maryland for the transfer of some National Emergency

Services Academy-Mobile Training Team (NESA-MTT) delivered courses into college semester hours. The arrangement includes up to nine semester hours of college credit. Both senior and cadet members can:

- Establish college enrollment and a transcript of courses through the college.
- Receive no-cost college course credit from attendance at recognized NESA-MTT delivered courses, to be used toward completion of an associate degree in emergency management.
- Receive no-cost college course credit from attendance at recognized NESA-MTT delivered courses, to be used toward completion of a Certificate in Emergency Management.
- Be accepted into the college as an in-state resident without being charged nonresident fees.

In addition, cadets 16 years and older can be dual-enrolled in high school and college. Click <u>CAP Collegiate</u> <u>Transfer Program</u> to learn more!
